Here are an overview of each contest area:

- *Master-Tech. (Overall)*
 - *13 Stations at 6.5 minutes each*
 - *Station '13' will be a table where the students will be able to sit down with our divisional advisor and ask questions 1 on 1 about how college works, financial aid, scheduling, etc.*
 - *The 12 other stations will essentially be a combination of the traditional master-tech. stations and advanced level electrical stations.*
- *MLR (Light Repair)*
 - *13 Stations at 6.5 minutes each*
 - *Station '13' will be a 1 on 1 tour of our department including Motorcycle, Auto Body, and ASV Labs and Classroom spaces*
 - *The other 12 stations will be a combination of the traditional brakes, some new-vehicle prep. type stations, steering/suspension, and basic maintenance and electrical checks.*
